Each applicant must submit a completed application, including a 200-300 word essay and a detailed list of leadership activities, on or before the first day of the 2024 Fair. The top applicants will then be interviewed by a panel of judges. The application and interview are weighted equally in the selection process.

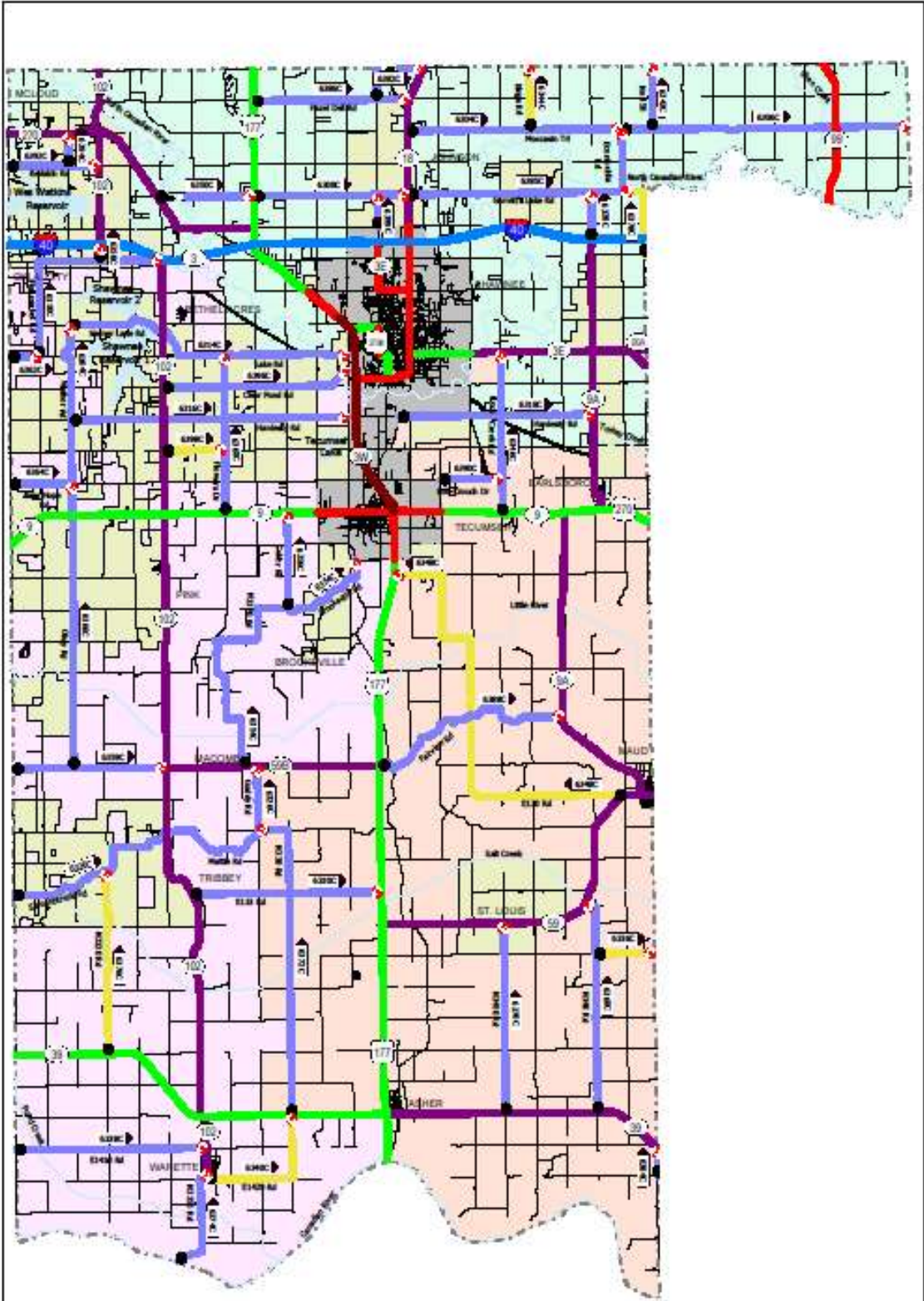
The list of duties and responsibilities of a Junior Fair Board Member are as follows:
